## OVERALL GOALS

This symposium is a two day educational event that focuses on the most up-to-date techniques for the treatment of peripheral vascular disease and includes brief “technique and results” sessions on evolving endovascular therapies. Our nationally recognized faculty will address issues in current clinical practice, complications and pitfalls of newer technologies, and discuss the evolution of the field. Using a systems-based approach, the format will cover all major areas of vascular disease. Attendee participation and interaction will be emphasized and facilitated through debates, Q & A sessions and interactive case presentations.

- Review the medical and surgical decision making principles in the management of the neuropathic foot including bracing, reconstruction, and medication selection
